

Oak and Iron Tavern access guide

Getting there:

There are several bus routes into Mount Barker, and the nearest bus stops to the Oak and Iron Tavern are

Stop 63 Adelaide Road- 6 minute walk

Zone B Dumas St Park'n'Ride- 7 minute walk

There is a large carpark out the front of the venue.

Ordering:

You can use QR codes to order, or order at the nearest bar.

Entrances:

The entrance into the venue is flat and level, with automatic doors. There are also several side entrances into the venue.



Bistro area

As you enter the venue, the automatic doors make a noise.

There is:

- Warm lightbulbs
- Natural light from windows
- Fluorescent lights on the ceiling

There is music playing in this area.

The floor is carpeted. There are fabric chairs with tables. Some of the chairs and tables are higher, and some are lower.

There are small TVs playing in the venue, there may or may not be sound.

If you want to order, you can use the QR codes on the table, or go up to the main bar.





Outside area

Directly in front of the entrance is an outside dining area.

To the right, as you enter, there is an undercover area.

There is some noise from the road, and you may hear birds chirping.

There may be music playing on speakers.

There are lights that twinkle and change colour on the ceiling of the undercover area.

There are hard chairs, and booth seating.






To the left, as you enter, there is another outside dining area.

Here, the large garden area is visible.

There is a wooden deck with tables and chairs. There is a small step, but there is ramp access on the side.

You may hear the sounds of the sprinkler, in the garden.

There are hard chairs with cushions, and booth seating.





Restaurant

The restaurant area has carpeted flooring.

There are padded and unpadded chairs at tables to choose from.

The outside area is fully visible but noise should not be noticeable.

There are fluorescent lights on the ceiling, and natural light from the windows.

There are also hanging lamps with exposed light bulbs.

If you sit near the main bar, you may hear the sounds of plates and cutlery clattering, and sounds of the till opening and closing.

There is a fireplace which is used during cold weather.





Toilets

You can access the toilets through the hallway, in the restaurant area.

The toilet doors say 'D' for disabled, 'F' for female and 'M' for male.

The toilets have both paper towel, and hand dryers.







Quiet Dinner

The Quiet Dinner will be held in the Robert Charles Room.

The room will be made into a private space, by closing the partition between the room and the restaurant area.

There will be no music playing, and lights will be dimmed.

You can enter through the main entrance, or through a separate entrance directly to the Robert Charles Room. There will be signage to let you know where to go.

There will be a private bar available, so you will not have to enter the restaurant to order. There are also separate toilets in the Robert Charles Room.

Booking is encouraged.

There will be sensory toys available and a quiet space in the Barr Smith Billiard Room nearby.

There are male, female and disabled toilets available in the Robert Charles Room. The toilets look similar to the hallway toilets, with hand dryers and paper towels.

The setup of the room may look different to below:
